VICE-CHANCELLOR MESSAGE



Legal education has evolved to meet changing needs and visions and has changed significantly over time. Its objectives have been multiple, or even ambiguous has been the extent to which it should focus on the skills necessary for actual law practical (The MacCrate Report). Global Law Deans' Forum 2013 organized by the International Association of Law Schools, Washington at National University of Singapore during September 25th – 27th, 2013 developed principles of outcomes of Legal Education in the form of Singapore Declaration. (Singapore Declaration on Global Standards and Outcomes of Legal Education.) It says that there will be three main outcomes of a legal education. These are broadly- Knowledge, Skills and Values.

Knowledge in legal education means to understand the nature of Legal Rules and Institutions, knowledge of and ability to use the most fundamental tools of legal research, understanding of the process of devising and implementing a coherent and effective research design. It includes identifying and formulating legal issues, formulating relevant legal theory, elaborating legal theory, evaluating legal theory and criticising and synthesizing legal argumentation.

Skills learning includes diagnosing a problem, generating alternative solutions and strategies, developing a plan of action, implementing the plan and keeping the planning process open to new information and new ideas. It includes fact gathering, factual investigation, organizing information, using effective methods of communication (orally and in writing), and how to comply with legal requirements.

Values a law graduate should know and understand the need to act in accordance with the professional ethics prescribed by the BCI and fundamental principles of justice and the rule of law.

Legal education is now passing through the intellectually liberating path of inter-disciplinary as well as multidisciplinary method of study to accept challenges of globalization and the new world order which is said to be as revival of Kantian 'law of peoples". 'Justice', the core value of our Constitution must become central to law curriculum of Law Schools. Accordingly curriculum of WBNUJS has been designed with a move away from doctrinalism and giving much emphasis on practical approaches in legal education. Accordingly we have a wide range of optional courses and credit courses challenging the legitimacy of dominant juridical ideology.

Above are not all aspects of teaching learning process and research at WBNUJS but focus on only some particular interests of the University. These principles may be said as the base for our continuing discourse of exploring and identifying essentials of legal education and scholarship which will properly prepare our students to meet the challenges of the world they will inherit. We are always welcoming innovative ideas and suggestions.

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GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

The West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS) was established under the WBNUJS Act, 1999 (West Bengal Act IX of 1999). The university hev recognised under sub-section 2 (f) and section 12-b by the UGC. The BA LL.B and BSc. LL.B are affiliated by the Bar Council of India. Hon'ble Chief Justice of India is the Chancellor of the University and Chairman of its highest governing body - the General Council.

In its relatively short existence, NUJS has firmly established itself as one of the premier national law universities in India. NUJS ranked 4th in NIRF India Ranking 2023 under Law category. It has consistently been ranked amongst the top law schools in India in reviews conducted by the likes of Outlook India, Mint and LexisNexis Halsbury's Law Monthly. The University had received the prestigious SILF-MILAT INSTITUTIONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD 2015 for its overall excellence in the field of Legal Studies.

LOCATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE:

NUJS is located in the city of Kolkata, a major metropolis of India. Kolkata, the City of Joy, is renowned for its heritage and culture. A subtle blend of tradition and modernity distinguishes the city. The old Kolkata thrives alongside the growing expanses of modern townships, including Salt Lake City, where the NUJS campus is situated.

The campus itself comprises of one academic and three residential blocks (i.e. two seven-storied halls of residence for girls and boys each and a two-storied staff accommodation quarters NUJS has also received adjacent land of 3025.75 sq. metres for construction of additional hostel facilities, staff quarters, conference rooms, guest house and other amenities for the students. The Academic Block, named after Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, is a four-storied majestic edifice in stone, having 105 rooms in all. The NUJS campus provides all modern amenities— air-conditioned classrooms of varying sizes, seminar halls, conference rooms, moot court hall and an air-conditioned auditorium (with a seating capacity of approximately six hundred) doctors room, and other facilities. The highlight of NUJS is a well-stocked, digitized, air-conditioned library, with access to over 45,000 volumes on law, economics, politics, etc., national and international journals and all major online internet resources for law and other related social science subjects, as well as the facility to download, print and photocopy any materials. Remote access facility is available for students, faculty and researchers for ease of access to library e-resources. The NUJS campus also includes a bank, a canteen, stateof the-art kitchens at the hostel, health care including health insurance, sports facilities including airconditioned gym and various other recreational facilities. All student hostels are wired with Internet access through dedicated leased lines and Wifi. The university also has a computer Centre for students. The University had hired a four storied two hostel blocks and a two storied building from BSNL within the Salt Lake City for the B.Sc. LL.B (Hons.) in Criminology and Forensic Science.

LIBRARY

The University Central Library occupies a central location commanding a spectacular view of the quadrangle and hostels. The Reading Room is spread over 758 sq. metres of floor space providing 400 seats. As an integral component of the academic programs, the Library supports the University's teaching and research. The Library is much more than a repository for the accumulated knowledge in law and social sciences, it serves as the heart of our intellectual enterprise. The NUJS library is a participating member of INFLIBNET's UGC-INFONET consortium whereby it regularly contributes to SHODHGANGA, and SHODHGANGOTRI. It is also a member of National Digital Library of India (NDLI) since 2018.

Books: The Library has a collection of more than 30,000 books including some rare out of print titles gifted by eminent persons from their personal collection

Journals & Bound Volumes: The Library subscribes to 100 journals and 13 daily newspapers. The back issues of the journals are bound and we now have over 6000 volumes of bound journals.

Archives: The Library archives hold the complete sets of Fleet Street Report, Public Law, AntiTrust Law Journal, All England Law Reports from 1558 and AIR from 1920 onwards. We have been enriched by donations from eminent legal luminaries and organisations.

Online Databases: We also subscribe to 29 IP based online databases in law and social sciences.





PROGRAMMME AND PEDAGOGY

NUJS strives to offer the best in legal education in order to prepare its graduates for the diverse spheres of litigation, corporate legal practice, legal academia, legal research, social service and public leadership. It offers various academic programmed including:

- 1.5 Year integrated B.A. LL.B (Hons.)
- 2.5 Year integrated B.Sc. LL.B (Hons.) in Criminology and Forensic Science
- 3.1 Year LL.M. with Specialized streams on:
 - Corporate and Commercial Law,

 - o Criminal and Security Laws,
 - o Intellectual Property Law
 - Law & Technology
- 4. M.Sc. in Forensic Sciences

- 6. LL.D Degree Programme

The Faculty at NUJS adopt the Socratic method of teaching, involving extensive classroom discussion and debate. The academic year is divided into two semesters of equal duration, which are followed by examinations at the end of each semester. For each course, students undergo rigorous skill development through project writing, viva voce and class presentations. The courses combine purely legal theories with social sciences, to provide our students with a holistic appreciation of law in its interaction with society from a multi-disciplinary perspective. These include inter alia Gender and Law, Law and Public Policy, Law and Development, Corporate Finance, International Commercial Arbitration, Securities Law, Judicial Review, Competition Law, Nuclear Law, International Human Rights Law, Sports Law and Law and Economics, which give students the opportunity to specialize in their preferred areas of study. In principle, only foundational courses are compulsory while all the rest are electives. Different forms of evaluation including open-book exams, seminars, research papers, tutorials and court room exercises are used in these courses. Grading of results is done on a Ten-point scale.

At the end of each semester, students intern in various organizations including law firms, senior counsel chambers, corporate in-house legal departments, NGOs, research and policy think-tanks, etc. while the choice of internships remain with students, University also provides assistance in arranging internships through the Recruitment and Placement Committee.

The students are also encouraged to participate in serious research, writing and academic scholarship through the medium of the University's in-house law journals and publications. NUJS Law Review, which is a quarterly publication, also been ranked as the number one academic law journal of India by the Washington and Lee University School of Law ranking of law journals. Other Law journals include the Journal of Indian Law and Society, Asian Journal of Air and Space Law, Asian Journal of Legal Education, International Journal of Law and Policy Review and International Journal of Legal Studies & Research.

The University has signed several Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) recently with various Universities including King's College London; The University Of Waikato, New Zealand; Maulana Abul Kalam Azad University Of Technology (MAKAUT, W.B.), National Institute of Technical Teachers' Training & Research (NITTTR), Kolkata; Central Forensic Science Laboratory, Kolkata; The Institute of Company Secretaries of India, New Delhi; The Associated Chambers of Commerce and Industry of India, ASSOCHAM; National Academy for Planning and Development (NAPD), Bangladesh; North Bengal University; Edcil India Limited, IIT Khargapur, IIIT Kalyani, IISER, Kolkata in addition to the existing ones such as University of Illinois; Ecole de formation de Barreau, Paris, Comillas Pontifical University, Madrid; for the purpose of exchange programmes for both faculty members and students. Faculty and students have been participating in such Exchange Programmes with several of these universities.

SKILL LEARNING AND CO-CURRICULUM ACTIVITIES

NUJS has a diverse and vibrant student community hailing from all parts of India, and includes several foreign nationals. While the key focus is academics, the students are also keenly involved in sporting and cultural exchanges and activities, with teams regularly excelling at various national level competitions. Student societies of NUJS organize five major annual events- the literary-cum-cultural extravaganza- Outlawed, the national sports festival- Invicta, the NUJS-Herbert Smith National Corporate Law Moot Court Competition, Justice Dr. BP Saraf National Tax Moot Court Competition, The NUJS-SAM Fintech Moot Court Competition and the NUJS Parliamentary Debate. These events attract enormous participation from the best law schools in the country.

Student societies also conduct popular year-round competitions in music, dance, painting, quizzing, debating, creative writing and sports. Adding colour to life at NUJS are the western and eastern music bands, which have proved their mettle at competitions all across the country. NUJS also has a vibrant SPICMACAY chapter, and has hosted performers like Pt. Hariprasad Chaurasia, Pt. Shiv kumar Sharma and Smt. Shovana Narain. Writer's Block, the college magazine, contains campus news, contributions in prose and poetry, giving students with literary inclinations the chance to showcase their talent. Students at NUJS are ever-aware of their social responsibilities. The Legal Aid Society provides a platform for students to apply the knowledge and skills acquired in the classroom and meaningfully contribute to the community.

The Society takes up legal causes of indigent people either independently or in association with other organizations, assists other law schools in setting up their legal aid clinics and programmes, organizes legal awareness camps and street plays in urban and rural areas, and conducts adult education and legal awareness courses for mess, housekeeping, security and other supporting staff of NUJS. Students have also begun assisting pro bono lawyers from Human Rights Law Network (HRLN) in pending cases before the Juvenile Justice Board in Kolkata. NUJS believes that it is only such holistic legal education that can create the well-rounded leaders of tomorrow.

The University has an enviable track record in moot court competitions. NUJS students emerged as the first Indian and only the second Asian team to win the prestigious Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot, Vienna. They have also been the proud winners of the ELSA Moot Court Competition, held in Dominican Republic. In addition, NUJS students have also won honours in Willem C. Vis (East) International Commercial Arbitration Moot, Hong Kong, the Stetson International Environment Moot Court Competition, Florida, Manfred Lachs Space Law Moot, Stetson International Environment Law Moot, Oxford Price Media Moot Court Competition, along with almost every National moot court competition of note. NUJS students have also won several essay competitions, attended and presented papers at conferences all over the world, and have secured regular publications in peer-reviewed journals of international repute.

With such a comprehensive academic and co-curricular programme, it is scarcely surprising that in the relatively short span of the University's existence, NUJS alumni have distinguished themselves in a range of careers, not only on the national but also on the international stage. NUJS alumni Meet is held now every year to strengthen bonds the University and the alumni for the purpose of leveraging the alumni community towards fulfillment of University's role in promoting cutting edge legal education.

The Student Recruitment Committee at NUJS boasts of a near 100% success rate in recruitment almost every year. Graduating students join leading law firms and companies in India and abroad, clerk with judges at the Supreme Court, and work towards the betterment of society with prestigious NGOs. Several alumni are litigators at the Supreme Court and various High Courts.

Each year an increasing number of NUJS students gain admission to prestigious universities in U.K. like Oxford and Cambridge, and Ivy League universities of the U.S. such as Yale, Harvard and NYU. Many of them have been awarded prestigious scholarships like RHODES, CHEVENING and INLAKS to pursue higher studies.

FACULTY

NUJS has an excellent faculty with a good mix of young and experienced scholars. The faculty includes Rhodes, Fulbright, Commonwealth and Chevening scholars, and alumni from universities including Oxford University, Harvard Law School, Columbia University, University of Michigan, SOAS, University of Vanderbilt, London School of Economics, NUS, University of Liverpool and Max Planck Institute. Faculty members have also published in numerous prestigious international and national law journals.

Many scholars of international repute from within and outside the country, including luminaries like Amartya Sen, Joseph Stiglitz, Late Mr. Pranab Mukherjee, Mr. Pranab Bardhan, Mark Tushnet, Philippe Cullet, Prof. Timothy Endicott, Prof. Upendra Baxi, Justice M.N. Venkatachaliah, Mr. K.K. Venugopal, Mr. Vinod Rai (CAG), Justice Michael Kirby, Prof. Partha Chatterjee, Sir James Alexander Mirrless, Mr. Hans Schodder, Ms. Medha Patkar, Sri M K Narayanan, Sri M C Bhandare, Mr. Sanjay Parikh, Justice A. S. Anand, Prof Ved P. Nanda, Late Prof. N. R. Madhava Menon, Shri Soli J Sorabjee, Prof. Uday Raj Rai, Prof. Marc S Galanter, Prof. Martha Nussbaum, Mr. Lawrence Liang, Prof. Upendra Baxi, Hon'ble Justice Sonam Tobgye, Shri Gopal Krishna Gandhi, Prof. Catherine Mac Kinnon, Professor Prabhat Patnaik, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Uday Umesh Lalit, Hon'ble Justice Ashim Kumar Roy and Hon'ble Justice Jyotirmoy Bhattacharya, Prof. (Dr.) Umakanth Varottil, Prof. (Dr.) Amita Singh,

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Jasti Chelameswar and Hon'ble Mr. Justice D.Y. Chandrachud have visited the University to deliver special lectures or offer short-courses on diverse subjects. The University has also entered into Memorandum of Understanding with several premier institutions across the globe for research exchange collaboration with many prestigious universities of global repute. It also has several Endowment Chairs. The University has instituted the Ford Foundation Chair on Human Rights, the MHRD Chair on Intellectual Property Rights and Sir Justice Ashutosh Mookerjee Chair for studies in Tradition, Law and Social Transformation in Bengal. Supported by a substantial grant from the West Bengal government, the Centre for Regulatory Studies, Governance & Public Policy (CRSGPP) was established at NUJS for its research activities across Bengal. Several lectures and workshops have been conducted by the Centre since its inception. WBNUJS had also received Fund from Department of Justice, Govt of India for ADR research and from Ministry of Consumer Affairs Food and Public Distribution for organizing various Consumer related courses. During the Covid period NUJS conducted various online national and international seminars in field IPR, Public Policy, Financial Law Environmental Law and Criminal Justice system.

FEES & SCHOLARSHIPS

Despite being able to achieve the status of an academic institution of exceptional caliber, NUJS has maintained a relatively modest fee structure. It further seeks to ensure that no student is forced to discontinue studies on account of financial constraints. With generous donations from individual donors and institutions, the University has built up a Scholarship Fund, proceeds of which are disbursed to students every year on a "need" basis. The Government of West Bengal has provided the University with a generous grant for revenue expenditure including supporting the 'means-cummerit scholarship' granted by the University. Rupees 50 lakhs has been earmarked for supporting merit-cum-scholarship program. In addition to that 5% domicile students will be provided with full tuition waiver scholarship.

The alumni of NUJS have also instituted many scholarships. Arrangements are in place for students of NUJS to secure educational loans from any bank of their choice on mutually agreeable terms. NUJS aims to reach out to potential candidates across the length and breadth of India and aboard. It provides quality education to those hailing from the most marginalized and poorest sections of society. All efforts are made to provide free or subsidized education to such students. NUJS also offers separate scholarships sponsored by various donors. In addition, NUJS Students can also avail of various scholarship schemes sponsored by the Central Government and the State Government for underprivileged and economically weaker sections.

TOWARDS CREATING LEADERS AND SOCIAL ENGINEERS

NUJS perceives legal education as a potent instrument that will help bring about improved social order contributing to national development.

Globalization has thrown up new challenges and newer issues of concern. NUJS students are expected to adequately arm themselves to combat these challenges for the future. The standards of conduct and rigor at NUJS are already quite demanding. Those who join NUJS are expected not only to sustain, but also to improve upon these standards. NUJS promises the best returns for their dedication, labour and committed efforts. In all, the NUJS experience will enable students to think out of the box and equip them with skills necessary to transform them into the social engineers and leaders of tomorrow.


